#### Guest Speaker - Don Hewson

Don Hewson is currently the Managing Director, Industrial Liaison, for the University of Western Ontario Research Park in Sarnia-Lambton. His current responsibilities include progressing the Research Park's four main objectives — economic development, advancing innovation, attracting highly qualified personnel, and developing a more entrepreneurial culture.

Don accepted his current position in 2005 after nearly 30 years of fundamental and applied research, innovation, and commercialization at Imperial Oil Research in Sarnia. These years were mainly characterized by special custom product development work for Canadian, US, and international customers.

An honours B.Sc. degree in chemistry and math at Mt. Allison University was followed by a Ph.D. in biophysical chemistry and the University of Alberta, and an NRC Postdoctoral Fellowship at the University of Illinois, Champaign-Urbana, in biochemistry.

From his current position, he is thrilled to have one foot in academia, the other foot in industry, and both hands in the Sarnia-Lambton community.
