March Speaker

David Faulker is from Astutue Inc located in Houston Texas. Astute is a private company categorized under Filtration Devices, Electronic. David will be speaking on the NESSI adapters. To date, NeSSI has served as a forum for the adoption and improvement of an industrial standard which specifies the use of miniature and modular Lego-like flow components. NeSSI has also issued a specification which has been instrumental in spurring the development and commercialization of a plug and play low power communication bus (NeSSI-bus) specifically designed for use with process analytical sample systems in electrically hazardous environments.

The specific objectives of NeSSI are:


- 1. Increasing the reliability of these systems through the use of increased <u>automation</u>,
- 2. Shrinking their physical size and energy use by means of miniaturization,
- 3. Promoting the creation and use of industry standards for process analytical systems,.
- 4. Helping create the infrastructure needed to support the use of the emerging class of robust and selective microAnalytical sensors.
