August 27, 2007 Executive Board Meeting

A motion was passed to enter an ISA Sarnia submission in the competition to take stewardship of the "Dow Sarnia Legacy Fund". This fund is intended to leave a perpetual legacy of Dow Canada in the Sarnia-Lambton area.

The basic concept of the ISA Sarnia submission is a simple educational endowment, aimed at the best and brightest students in Science and Technology, in all elementary and secondary schools. In spirit, it is actually a continuation of the youth work we have already undertaken through our work and sponsorship of the Big Brothers Rocketry Program and The Lambton County Science Fair. If our submission was to win the competition, ISA Sarnia would be responsible, with the Sarnia Community Foundation as community enabler, to run an annual competition for "The Dow - ISA Sarnia Awards for Scientific Excellence". The amount of the Dow Legacy gift will be for somewhere between \$500,000 and \$1 Million.

Our submission has met all Dow Project criteria, therefore it has been pre-qualified for the competition. We are now in a very exciting position. Just being accepted for the Dow Sarnia Legacy Project competition will raise our profile in the Sarnia-Lambton area simply because of the very public nature of the Dow Sarnia Legacy Project, and the large dollar amount of the "Prize".

Presidents Address





ISA Sarnia Section is 60 years old!



The year 2007 marks a major milestone in the history of the I.S.A. Sarnia Section. We are marking the occasion of our 60th Anniversary Year. Six decades ago, a small group of people who worked on instruments and controls in the chemical and refining industries in Sarnia Ontario, gathered to form a new local organization aimed at sharing experiences and uniting practitioners in the relatively new field of industrial automation. It was September, 1947, and Sarnia, Ontario had entered it's own section into the fledgling "Instrument Society of America". The Second World War had recently ended, and Sarnia was a Canadian industrial powerhouse whose production strength had made a significant contribution to victory of the Allied Nations.

It was an exciting period in human history. Roughly six weeks after ISA Sarnia Section was formed, in October 1947, Chuck Yeager in his Bell X-1, became the first human to break the sound barrier. That same year, a decades-long controversy began over whether an extra-terrestrial craft had crashed near Roswell, New Mexico. In that time, children throughout the world were still being struck down with the crippling effects of Polio. In 1947 however, Dr. Jonas Salk began his research at the University of Pittsburgh, on a vaccine which would eventually defeat the poliovirus.

A massive amount of technological growth has occurred in the past sixty years, which makes me wonder. . .what would our section founders think of the ISA Sarnia Section now?

I believe one of the first things the founders would notice is that our I.S.A. Section now has over 140 regular members.(quite an impressive number!) Our membership is composed of a technically strong, highly respected network of members representing many different vocations, specialties and firms. Our section now organizes and mounts major technical trade shows, training seminars and conferences. As well it provides charitable support to several local groups including the "Big Brothers Rocketry Program" and the "Lambton County Science Fair". As it has always done in the past, ISA Sarnia Section will continue to evolve and develop, while continuing the same basic goal of maximizing the effectiveness of automation professionals worldwide.

It is an honour to serve as President during the 60th Anniversary Year of ISA Sarnia Section. Your Section Executive has plans to celebrate our 60th Anniversary in a big way, and are also working hard to bring the hottest new technical speakers and topics to our general meetings. I encourage all of our members, friends and colleagues to try to make an extra effort to come out, participate, network, and have fun at I.S.A.
