Technical Information Available on the Web

The amount of technical information available on the World Wide Web is increasing. There are online magazines, manufacturers web sites, email listservers and product directories. These resources are similar to print magazines, manufacturers support, networking and print directories. The web resources can be faster because of electronic search ability and large number of recipients of email listservers. Electronic information is updated fasted and takes less space than paper.

Example listservers are ISA Intech Readers Forum (www.isa.org/journals/index.html)and Control.com Automation List (www.control.com/ alist/index.html) Recipients subscribe to the listserver and receive all or selected messages that are sent to the listserver. You can send an email message asking a technical question or reply with an answer to someone's request. Some users like to carry on opinionated discussions about controversial topics.

There are many online magazines available, some for free access. The online magazines that are listed here have valuable technical content not just an online advertisement for the printed version. Some of the online magazines require that you login each visit.

The ISA Online website (www.isa.org) includes Intech, Industrial Computing and Motion Control magazines. There are articles from issues dating back to January 1996 which can be searched by ISA members.

Control magazine (www.controlmagazine.com) is the online extension of CONTROL, a monthly magazine serving the needs of automation. control, and instrumentation professionals in the process industries. Back issues from February 1996 to the present are available to view and search.

Some articles are only available on the online magazine such as: 'Valve characteristics selection guidelines' and 'Understanding control valve bench set'. There are also control and automation tutorials such as: Fundamentals of Process Control and Basics of Proportional-Integral-Derivative Control.
