Lambton College Research & Innovation department has been ranked in the top three research college's in Canada by Research Infosource Inc. for the last four consecutive years. Lambton has established six research centers including Bioindustrial Process Research Centre (BPRC), Lambton Manufacturing Innovation Centre (LMIC), Lambton Water Centre (LWC), Lambton Energy Research Centre (LERC) Information Technology & Communication Research Centre (ITCRC) and the Centre for Industrial Material Development that collaborate with small and medium sized companies (SMEs). Andrea Hands, Manager of Partnership, Strategic Initiatives & Communications and Steve Reaume, Associate Director of Research Operations will present about the research model at Lambton, how R&I supports Sarnia-Lambton and beyond. In addition project examples from each of the research centres will be presented.
